The Team is on call 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year; Each team member is a volunteer who lives within the local community, has a full time occupation and brings with them their own specialist skills and knowledge, ensuring for a diverse and very capable rescue unit; Currently the team has specialists in industrial rope access, first aid and advanced trauma care as well as advanced land navigation and search management; The team are highly trained in a wide range of disciplines including water rescue, missing person search techniques, technical rope rescue, 4x4 support, radio communications, emergency life support and helicopter operations; and Although primarily tasked with coastal and cliff rescue incidents, the team can deploy inland if required to assist other emergency services with missing person searches or rescue operations where our specialist equipment and techniques can be deployed. Noted. 4. **Council Plan and Budget Engagement** Rhona Arthur gave an update on the Draft Council Plan and advised there **Rhona Arthur** will be a wider consultation on the Budget that the Locality Partnership will be involved in. The Draft Council Plan was well received by the Locality Partnership as it was simple and easy to read. Noted. **Future Priorities** 5. Rhona Arthur advised that funding has been secured to proceed with a Rhona Arthur Charrette to revisit the priorities for Kilwinning in February 2019. A further report will be brought to the next Locality Partnership meeting in March 2019. Noted. **HSCP Locality Forum Update** 6. Sam Falconer and Scott Bryan provided a verbal update from the HSCP Locality Forum:-Looking at new priorities; Engagement Pilot – engaging with the people of Kilwinning to find out what they feel the HSCP Locality Forum Priorities should be; and Rhona Arthur The HSCP Locality Forum Engagement Officer to attend future meetings of the Kilwinning Locality Partnership.

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Rhona Arthur gave an update on the Participatory Budgeting event that took place in March. The event had the highest turnout of 559 people with 530 votes, 34 applications out if which 17 received funding. The Council approved part of the grounds maintenance budget to be reserved for participatory budgeting to take effect from 1 April 2019. A successful pilot in the Three Towns will be replicated for the other localities. A consultation mandate will be prepared for Kliwinning with the aim of setting out how we will engage and consult with members of the public. Rhona Arthur discussed the future of the Participatory Budgeting fund and suggested 10% could be moved from the CIF fund to help support smaller local projects. Discussion followed and the Locality Partnership agreed not to move any money from the CIF Fund and suggested a report to Council on the future of Participatory Budgeting. Noted. 8. Locality Co-Ordinator Update and Locality Plan Louise Riddex provided a report on the work which has been undertaken in the Kilwinning Locality including a recent meeting with Eglinton Growers on their Community Garden project.
