3.	Coastguard Rescue Service				
	Kevin Paterson and Gemma Little from the Ardrossan Coastguard Rescue Service gave a presentation and highlighted some of the points below:				

- The Team is on call 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year;
- Each team member is a volunteer who lives within the local community, has a full time occupation and brings with them their own specialist skills and knowledge, ensuring for a diverse and very capable rescue unit;
- Currently the team has specialists in industrial rope access, first aid and advanced trauma care as well as advanced land navigation and search management;
- The team are highly trained in a wide range of disciplines including water rescue, missing person search techniques, technical rope rescue, 4x4 support, radio communications, emergency life support and helicopter operations; and
- Although primarily tasked with coastal and cliff rescue incidents, the team can deploy inland if required to assist other emergency services with missing person searches or rescue operations where our specialist equipment and techniques can be deployed.

	Rhona Arthur gave an update on the Participatory Budgeting event that took place in March. The event had the highest turnout of 559 people with 530 votes, 34 applications out if which 17 received funding.	
	The Council approved part of the grounds maintenance budget to be reserved for participatory budgeting to take effect from 1 April 2019. A successful pilot in the Three Towns will be replicated for the other localities. A consultation mandate will be prepared for Kilwinning with the aim of setting out how we will engage and consult with members of the public.	
	Rhona Arthur discussed the future of the Participatory Budgeting fund and suggested 10% could be moved from the CIF fund to help support smaller local projects.

10. **Locality Youth Forum Update** Louise Riddex The Locality Partnership agreed to co-opt a Cunninghame South MSYP to the Kilwinning Locality Partnership and attend all future meetings. Members of the Youth Forum gave an update and the following points were raised: The Youth Forum held their AGM and formed a new committee: Members volunteered at the Kilwinning Christmas light event on 22 November; and The consultation with over 750 young people, on the need for a purpose built youth facility in the main street. The findings are currently being analysed and a reports will be shared when available. Damien Taylor requested a reference from Tim Ross for a cashback application that the Youth Forum are submitting. Kilwinning **Progress Report**

Reporting Period – Jan-March 19

All staff now in place in the Kilwinning Team.



General

Funding for Charrette is now in place and an initial planning meeting was held with the company who are carrying out the charrette, along with some of the Locality Partnership members. Looking at the charrette being completed by end June.

Staff working with Cranberrymoss Community Association to look at organising mental health toolkit sessions. The goal from this is to evaluate community needs and establish if there is want/need of a Men's/Women's Sheds.

Cranberrymoss would also like an ASN Group, targeting residents of Penny burn as they feel there is a gap in this kind of support. Staff are working alongside the chair of the Community Association to look at this.

On yer Bike looking at possibility of asset transfer for the building, and will be supported in this if they wish to take it forward. Staff are also assisting them to better promote and advertise their cause for a healthier lifestyle through cycling.

Louise attended HSCP Locality Forum Engagement Steering group. Will continue to attend and look at working closer together.

Update



Work & Local Economy Now have a member of staff (Kieran Morrell) in to support the Employability Hubs. Meeting took place with employability and skills staff and Locality Officers to look at a much more focussed approach and ensure everyone is clear on what their role is within the hub. Training to be rolled out to hub staff across North Ayrshire to ensure the same message is going out in all hubs.

Number still not great in Kilwinning hub. Will look at how we can try to increase these.

Sub Group meeting has been arranged and will take place on 7 March. As Cllr Glover has been off ill, Cllr Cullinane is going to attend in the meantime to chair the meting.

Learners Voice – Anne-Marie Hunter working with staff within the team to take this forward. Possibly going to be Locality Based Learners Voice rather than North Ayrshire wide as previously planned.

Various youth groups within Kilwinning are working towards accredited awards.

Traffic and parking

Update

Had sub group meeting. Group agreed that we have probably gone as far as we can with this and the partnership had agreed at the last LP meeting that we should start looking at another priority to replace this. Louise to ensure feedback from the consultation is given via Kilwinning Community Council social media.

Mark Henry (roads dept) attended sub group meeting and has provided feedback from the roads mobile radar unit to show how many vehicles entered main st in a week. The total was 369.



Housing and community (environmental issues)

Update

Met with Procurement. They advised to get at least 3 quotes for outdoor gym equipment. Donald has been working on this. Quotes are now in and have been sent around the full partnership for comment. The quotes are a bit higher than initially anticipated therefore Louise has spoken to Rosemary Fotheringham about other possible funders. Looking at around another £20,000. Donald has already approached the landfill to note interest. Louise will look at arranging a sub group meeting after the Locality Partnership meeting.

Staff are Working closely with Eglinton Growers sub-committee (Community Garden) to support them in their funding bids, publicising upcoming events and create working partners. For example, the Princes Trust run a continuous 12 week team challenge programme, 2 of the 12 weeks are spent giving back to the community. The goal of our staff is to try and establish a partnership to see if they would be interesting in using the community garden as their project and building an outdoor classroom.

Staff Assisting where they can alongside Eglinton Country Park Ranger in the progression or creating a community garden. Local chit chat for garden ideas is on Feb 20th.

Staff are continuing to work with the young people who attend the Young Eglinton Growers group (youth allotments). The group are ready to start ground prep, sow seeds, paint decking and lay slabs. They will be looking to secure new funding to develop new projects. The work at this group also contributes to the young people's hours for various different awards.

Subject: Youth Forums and Citizenship and Partnership work

Purpose: This report is to inform the Kilwinning Locality Partnership about Youth Forum,

Youth Citizenship/Partnership activity, planned and actual for the Kilwinning Area.

Background

The Kilwinning Youth Forum strive to benefit the lives of young people in the Kilwinning area. We aim to achieve this by involving young people in Kilwinning in the decision making process and giving them a voice.

The Youth Forum actively assist in consulting with youth groups within Kilwinning, planning youth events, applying for funding including the Participatory Budgeting Youth Fund, Cashback and assisting in Community Events in partnership with the Promoting Kilwinning Group.

Key Points for Locality Partnership

The Youth Forum are organising a free Family Fun Day on Saturday 16 March, 12pm to 3pm at Cranberry Moss Community Centre with donations for the ASN Group. The event will include inflatables, arts n crafts, DJ, face painting, balloon making, mini activities, local stalls and much more.

Four local young people from Kilwinning were part of the first youth led Cashback panel within Scotland to decide funding for the North Ayrshire area. Local groups that were successful within the locality were the Youth Forum, ASN Group, Barnardos and the Playz.

The Youth Forum have consulted with over 750 young people, and are in the middle of collating the results, on the need for a purpose built youth facility in the main street in Kilwinning. The group are then going to analyse the findings and create a report to share with everyone

Junior Youth Forum is now established and members are participating in a range of informal learning opportunities including interpersonal violence and internet safety and inputs from key agencies in the local community, and recently NAC Recycling programme.

Four young people from the Kilwinning locality have been nominated for the MSYP elections

Members of the Youth Forum attend the Kilwinning Community Council monthly meetings and attend Locality Partnership Meetings where necessary.

Eleven young people from our PDA Group in Kilwinning Academy have been on placement with local groups as part of this programme

Some of our members are part of the Planning Committee for North Ayrshire Youth Festival 2019.
