	The Chair welcomed members to the meeting and apologies for absence were noted.

	The action note from the Three Towns Locality Partnership meeting on 5 March was noted.	
3.	Castle Heritage Centre	
	The Locality Partnership received a presentation from the Ardrossan Castle Heritage Society. The presentation gave an update on the recent archaeological excavation on Castle Hill in Ardrossan which explored the changing uses of the hill over the last 300 years and the findings. The presentation also highlighted the Ardrossan Castle Heritage Society's plans to create a Heritage Hub at the Castle, similar to the one at Dundonald Castle with the hope it could be a centre for outdoor learning and could link in with Primary education.	

	The Partnership asked the Locality Officer to forward a copy of the CIF guidance and application form to the Castle Heritage Society and for them to link in with North Ayrshire Council Tourism work. Noted.	Shirley Morgan
4.	Story Maps The Locality Partnership received a presentation from Damien Griffith on Story Maps. The presentation highlighted the benefits of the new tool and how it can be used in our communities. A link to Story Maps will be published on the Community Planning Partnership website Noted.	
5.	Ardrossan Harbour The Locality Partnership received a presentation from Karen Yeomans on Ardrossan Harbour. The presentation highlighted the following: - • Ministerial decision • Partner Vision • Wider Town Regeneration • Wider Regeneration Proposals • Project Objectives • Concept for Quay • Concept for Terminal Maritime Hub • Preferred Option • Operational Benefits The partnership would be kept informed of progress following the final approval by Transport Scotland for the Berthing arrangements Noted.	
6.	Shirley Morgan referenced an update on the work which has been undertaken in the locality which was included in the agenda pack and highlighted the following points: - • Stevenston Beach Local Nature Reserve 20 th Anniversary Celebration on 9 June; and • Ardrossan Community Development Trust have successfully recruited enough members and trustees to start and should be set up as a limited company soon. Noted.	

Shirley Morgan confirmed that the plan had been drafted and would be brought to a future meeting. Jim McHarg remarked upon the sub- committee decision to continue their support for a local participatory event. He asked if the partnership could suggest a figure for disbursement Discussion followed, and the Locality Partnership agreed the sum of £34,000 for the Participatory Budget fund, be allocated from the CIF budget. A report would be prepared for submission to Cabinet for approval Community Investment Fund - Application The Partnership had previously heard an expression of interest in terms of Community Investment funding from the Shibumi Karate Club and offered their support in principle. The Partnership agreed to make a recommendation to the North Ayrshire Council Cabinet, that an award of £50,000 be made to Shibumi Karate Club from the Community Investment Fund, to enable a total draw down of regeneration funding in the sum of circa £500,000 to re-purpose the Saltcoats railway station for community use. 8. HSCP Update Clir Sweeney provided a verbal update from the HSCP Locality Forum: Noted. 9. Community Rep Update Denise McKenzie provided a verbal update from the Community Reps. The Sub groups were looking at quick fixes for the three towns area and suggested coloured beach huts for along the shore front that could be used by residents as well as pop-up shops, to encourage more visitors etc. There may be some planning issues around this so Planning and estates should be invited to the next meeting to discuss this further. Another suggestion was the use of some of the derelict land in the three towns area for growing. The Community reps will approach the owner of a section of derelict land to see if it could be planted to improve the aesthetic quality of the site. Community Investment Fund Expression of Interest Form

Ardrossan Castle Heritage Society
Set up in 2012, the aims of this organisation are:
Research : to advance the understanding of Ardrossan Castle and Castle Hill
Community : to encourage and facilitate community involvement at Ardrossan Castle
Education : to engage others in our growing understanding of Ardrossan Castle
Environment : to improve and promote Ardrossan Castle as a positive heritage destination
Ardrossan (Three towns)
£17,000
This proposal:
This project proposes a feasibility study of the potential of Ardrossan Castle Hill as a site for the construction of a small volunteer and visitor hub.
The volunteer and visitor centre:
In the future our vision is for a hub modelled on HES-linked Dundonald Castle.
The initial project would be more modest, focusing on essential accessible volunteer and visitor facilities and would not include an exhibition. These facilities would include:
ToiletsRefreshment point (but not a full café)
- Volunteer shelter, rest area, work space, equipment / protective clothing
storage
- Multi-purpose meeting / education room with storage for learning
 materials Possible digital interpretation of the site through Info Point or similar technology direct to visitors' hand held devices.
What the feasibility study would cover:
Architect / QS or surveyor time to prepare some basic costed plans, probably for a pre-fabricated building. Costings would need to include the provision of site services for water, waste water, power and telecoms. Early conversations with council planners would be needed on a range of matters including potential planning permission, road access, parking etc. Stakeholder conversations with Council / HES required.

Advice from a heritage adviser to design credible outcomes from the project in terms of additional volunteers, additional visitors, enhanced learning and enjoyment for visitors, more volunteer time available for care of the site and assets. Advice from a business planner / funding specialist: testing of community and stakeholder support; identifying contribution to regeneration outcomes for Ardrossan; estimates of potential visitor numbers; additional income sources e.g. from chargeable guided tours and events / room hire and donations; how outcomes will be delivered; risk management including permissions and consents / leases; governance and operational management; total project costs; cash flow projection; identification of funders likely to provide grant support for the hub to be put in place and to grant fund an upgraded volunteer and visitor activity programme and digital offer. Reporting Period July-Sept 2019

Sub groups have been meeting to achieve priorities with community groups

Incredible Edible group met with the Foodbank and Three Towns Growers. They plan to register with the Incredible Edible network. Met with all community volunteers/groups already involved with growing across the Three Towns and mapped current food growing.

Also met with private owner of some derelict land areas across the Three Towns to achieve partnership to develop more growing spaces

Signage and beach hut group have met with active travel manager to plan signs across Three Towns. This has been confirmed as being very achievable. Also, will keep them consistent across the Three Towns. Need to map where signs are best placed and highlight places of interest. Trails are to include coastal, historic and food growing

Contacted Sunderland City Council as they currently are developing beach huts and have received coastal communities funding for this. They are currently working with both Redcar and Northumberland who have huts already

The Foodbank holiday meal project has had record numbers attending both in Ardrossan and Stevenston - numbers had to be increased to 35 at each venue to facilitate all the children. Specsavers contacted the project and paid for a full school uniform including school bag for every child who attended

Ardrossan Community Development Trust are now a registered company limited by guarantee with companies' house. They have secured an office space and funding for a feasibility study and have engaged with a community arts consultant. They are planning an event to help inform them what Ardrossan means to the community of Ardrossan

Stevenston have a Steering Group to explore a development trust, this group have been involved with the town centre funding and have inputted to what is important to the community of Stevenston and what could be changed to help develop the town centre. They have had a visit from DTAS and Ardrossan community development trust. They are also going on site visits to other development trusts. They have set up a Facebook page which now has 62 members. The theme of the next meeting is to bring a friend to widen the reach of the group

Reporting Period July-Sept 2019

Update

Level Up Festival took place on Saturday the 15th of June. The Festival activities were Retro Console Gaming, pinball machines and original arcade cabinets, face painting, badge making, Dungeons and Dragons for Beginners, Table Top gaming and old school board games. Organised by the youth group called SCRATCH in partnership with North Ayrshire Youth Services and Stevenston Community Association. The event took place at the Ardeer Neighbourhood Centre and attracted just over 400 participants from across North Ayrshire and people from outwith North Ayrshire. The SCRATCH group are keen to make this an annual event

Saltcoats Harbour Group are successfully registered as a SCIO 4 director and around 10-15 people attending regularly for interest. They are in talks with DTAS, advised to apply for Scottish land fund for a feasibility test to be carried out to explore best option for them to get the harbour used by tourists / boats and the harbour house to be developed into a museum and craft hub

Sound on the Sands music gig was at the weekend with people traveling from all over Scotland to attend. Trying to sustain it for the future with tickets priced this year as opposed to last year when it was free

Argyle Community Association are planning a big free family open day. To promote a positive perception of them after being involved in a couple of negative issues over the last couple of months. They hope to attract more volunteers to the association

Stevenston Community Council visited Dumfries Station to meet with the West of Scotland Station Gardening Group to find out how the Three Towns station gardens are managed. Locality staff will promote the groups needs for local volunteers to enhance stations



• Stevenston North Community Association

Have been awarded PB food funding to help them start a Saturday breakfast club. They have been working to get their kitchen ready for environmental permission to operate and some have attended training to gain REHIS certificate.

They have also visited the Garnock Valley park lives projects and are determined to add a similar opportunity into their own 2020 programme of community opportunities

Three Towns Men's Shed

Have successfully agreed a service level agreement with community development, and agreed with NAC to stay in the focus learning centre until Dec 2020. This allows street scene a temporary use of the Three Towns Motor Project. The Men's Shed will move in to TTMP Dec 2020. They are planning an open day on 24th August to recruit more volunteers as they have more space now

• Saltcoats Harbour Association

The group are successfully registered as a SCIO 4 director and around 10-15 people attending regularly for interest. In talks with DTAS, they have been advised to apply for Scottish land fund in order to have a feasibility test carried out to explore the best option for them to get the harbour used by tourists/boats, and the harbour house to be developed into a museum and craft hub. They are planning a harbour open day in September



Community Regeneration



Reporting Period April- June 2019

- Stevenston Beach Nature Reserve held their 20^h Anniversary event which was successful with Ian being awarded a large framed map of the new nature reserve boundaries. He was also awarded an original litter picking trophy from Streetscene for his outstanding contributions to litter picking and changing the community's culture around litter awareness
- Litter Picking group visits continue to grow with schools, local groups and businesses all being involved. This is very much ongoing and a need for public liability has been identified
- Raise Your Voice with Ardeer Stevenston beach toilets plans have been held back with the engineer's report but architect has now changed engineer and promises an update by week beginning 12th August. Have put this project in the town centre funding, so £50,000 has been suggested towards this. The group have been having ongoing engagement with the community to explore their needs
- Three Towns Growers Have confirmed their new lease with NAC. This
 enables them to start drawing money down from lottery to start the
 build. Have been through a chair change but all is settling down, and the
 change is positive. The 3TG organised and delivered a 'Duck Race' on
 Stanley Burn. It was a fantastic event with over 300 people taking part
 and £2000+ being raised for 3TG community outreach activities on and
 off the allotment
- Ardrossan Youth Association have completed a community engagement to inform them of youth work in Ardrossan. The results have helped to inform what groups are now being offered to encourage more participation
- The community consultation around community facilities is planned for August/September. We will go back out to communities with the result of the community engagement exercise with proposals to them
- Harvies swimming pool consultation goes live on 19th August through until 8th September
- Ardrossan campus consultation starts in September, straight after the swimming pool consultation

In terms of s.15(4) of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1994 when determining whether an application should receive assistance from Common Good funds the Council should have regard to the interests of the inhabitants as a whole of the area to which the Common Good relates. The application is to assist with the cost of taking part in international karate competitions and while it is conceivable that such participation might inspire and encourage others in the local community to take it or other sports up, it is not clear that the application can be justified in terms of section 15(4). It seems likely that the principal beneficiaries of funding would be Aria and her family. I do not consider that the application demonstrates that a grant of funding would benefit the whole community.

If, however, the decision is taken to award a grant I would ask that the benefit to the whole community be recorded clearly as it is likely that the auditor will require this information.

The applicant resides in Saltcoats, however, as a former pupil of Ardrossan Academy, she previously received funding from the Ardrossan Common Good Fund to attend international competitions in 2017/18.

The applicant outlines that benefit to the local community in Ardrossan is achieved through her volunteering at Maximum Potential Health Gym in Ardrossan as part of an internship. She develops fitness programmes and provides coaching and aims to encourage those attending the gym. She also hopes to inspire young athletes to remain focused on their goals as well as giving young people the opportunity to work with her and witness how she has managed to progress in her chosen sport.
