


- SIMD 2020 published 28 January 2020
- Sixth in series (previous versions 2004, 2006, 2009, 2012, 2016)
- Looks at multiple deprivation not just about low income but also poor health, education, crime etc
- Measures relative deprivation there will always be a most deprived area even if everywhere improves
- Identifies small area deprivation at data zone level



#### Data Zones


- Originally based on 2001 Census population revised after 2011 Census
- Each data zone has population between 500 and 1,000
- Scotland now has 6,976 data zones (6,505 previously)
- North Ayrshire has 186 data zones (179 previously)
- Vary in geographical size rural areas larger due to sparser population density




# SIMD Methodology

- SIMD combines seven different "domains" of deprivation; Employment, Income, Health, Education, Access to Services, Crime, Housing
- 32 different indicators
- Domains weighted according to impact on overall deprivation
- Income/Employment 28% each, Health/Education 14% each, Access to Services 9%, Crime 5%, Housing 2%
- Each data zone ranked from 1 (most deprived) to 6,976 (least deprived) for the overall index and each domain – useful if looking at specific topics

## Rank in Scotland (15%)








#### **Domains**





- North Ayrshire is the 5th most deprived Council area in Scotland (the same as in 2016)
- On the broader 20% definition North Ayrshire is ranked 3rd most deprived
- 52 (28%) of North Ayrshire's 186 data zones are in the 15% most deprived in Scotland (compared to 51 (27%) in 2016)
- Deprivation is concentrated in The Three Towns and Irvine locality areas but Kilwinning and the Garnock Valley also have deprivation levels above the national average
- North Ayrshire deprivation is mainly concentrated on the employment, income and health domains



Irvine Map






Three Towns Map

Garnock Valley Map


