Planning Overview



- (Most) development or changes in the use of land and buildings requires planning permission
- Applications for planning permission are decided in accordance with the Development Plan
- The planning system in Scotland is changing:
 - development planning
 - development management
 - leadership skills and resourcing
 - permitted development
 - planning obligations
 - community engagement



What are Local Place Plans?

- A local place plan is a proposal as to the development or use of land prepared by a community body
- May also identify land and buildings that the community body considers to be of particular significance to the local area
- Set out reasons for considering that the Local Development Plan should be amended
- North Ayrshire Council must take any registered local place plans into account when preparing or amending the Local Development Plan
- Still a lot of questions!




