	<ul> <li>The Council had been successful in securing £23.7m from the UK Government's Levelling Up Fund (LUF) for major improvements to the road;</li> <li>Upgrading the B714 would significantly improve road connectivity between North Ayrshire and other parts of Scotland, helping to provide better road links and encourage investment in the area; and</li> <li>Discussion on active travel routes, including cycle way feasibility study and looking at the possibility of a safe cycle route between the 2 Primary Schools in Dalry.</li> </ul>	Louise Kirk
6.	Joint Health & Social Care Locality Planning Forum and LP on Mental Health and wellbeing	
	The Partnership received an update from Michelle Sutherland on the above. In particular, the following points were highlighted:	
	<ul> <li>the continuing challenges faced by Health and Social Care, with services under significant pressure due to Covid cases and staff requiring to self-isolate; and</li> <li>continued ongoing work on the development of priorities, which were likely to comprise of (i) improvement mental health for all ages across the Garnock Valley, (ii) social isolation, (iii) drug and alcohol present, early intervention and recovery and (iv) recovering from Covid (both in terms of services and individuals).</li> </ul>	
	Councillor DL Reid encouraged any local community groups in the Garnock Valley to make application to the Fund which had been set up to tackle social isolation and it was noted that there was a $\pounds$ 2,000 award of grant available in this regard.	
	The Partnership took the opportunity to pass on their best regards to Janet McKay, who would shortly be retiring from her post, and wished her a long, peaceful and happy retirement.
