3.	Police report	862 incidents reported with 220 crimes reported.  All residents are encouraged to report any incidents or any intelligence relating to any incident by calling 101.  BA raised there is a high number of issues regarding to dogs being aggressive in the town. It was clarified that Police deal with dogs that are dangerously out of control or banned and the dog warden will deal with general dog issues. If there is a dog continuously involved in attacking other dogs the police can submit a report to court and a sheriff will decide what will happen with the said dog.  There is a lot of quad bikes/trail bikes in open spaces. The police could confirm that there had been a number of reports lately and they have managed to catch and seize the bike.  Speeding down the harbour area is a big problem and there has been a meeting to discuss traffic calming proposals.  DD asked who has the responsibility for cars parked on the road with no MOT? It was clarified that this is the responsibility of NAC not the Police.  Parking is still a big issue in the town and the police are aware of it and they try to deal with any complaints that come in.
