Police Report: No Police present, the report was not received

MP to contact Police to ask for Police report

The Police report was received the night of the meeting [please see attachment 2023.03 Police report.pdf]. It reports 23 incident (a raise from 20 in 2022) and 2 crimes (a drop from 3 in 2022), plus a crime report being raised and investigated.

Bakkafrost presentation

A proposed development to be situated in Hunterston land. A recirculating aquaculture system to produce juvenile salmon (smolt) to be then transferred to marine fish farms.

The preapplication process is ongoing. Planning app expected in Q2 if no issues are encountered. The company was previously the Scottish Salmon Company, bought by Bakkafrost (from the Faroes) in 2020.

The project is to be land based; it will be the largest of its kind in Scotland, and it will rely on the latest technology aiming for true sustainability.

DT Will an EIA be done?

<u>Mr Laister</u> Will do it if NAC state it needs to be done. The project will have little impact on environment and visual amenity of the area.

<u>DN</u> If there is the potential for a significant environmental impact, an EIA is necessary. The development would be adjacent to a SSSI (albeit on land).

<u>Mr Laister</u> There would be boats for transportation of smolt to the farms for about 5 days quarterly. No plans to apply for a fish farm locally.

RH Where will the water for the system be sourced?

<u>Mr Laister</u> From Knockendoon reservoir. The most difficult part would be getting the waterpipe across (over or under) the railway line and the A78, but a high percentage (around 50%) of the infrastructure is already present. A discussion with Scottish Water has already been held. 170 cubic metres of water per hour would be used (non potable water, treated on site).

RH Will the quay be dredged?

<u>Mr Laister</u> Peel said it will, and that they will maintain it. Bakka would have access to it, they would not manage it.

NA Cllrs' report: IM, the only Cllr present, will intervene on individual points

1. Coastal path

<u>IM</u>: things are moving. The detailed design is complete, a total of £530,000 has been allocated for designing, managing and building the path. SusTrans plans to start building it after the summer period, expected completion in early 2024.

<u>MoP</u>: we were told that there would be works to widen the path between the Mound and Miller's Walk

IM Mr. Greg Brown is the access officer.

RH to contact Mr. Brown for further information.

<u>MoP</u> (Ferry Row resident): is it possible to have signs saying that, until completion of the path, cycling is not possible nor permitted?

MoP maps say that the path is already complete

IM to look into this.

2. Countess steps

<u>MoP</u> They are supposed to be maintained and cleaned by NAC, hasn't happened in a while, maintenance has been reduced. StreetScene have been approached, but they stated it is not their responsibility. They belong to Kelburn Estate who gave a long lease to NAC for the playpark area and the steps leading to it (Countess steps) in the 1930s.

<u>IM</u>; they have been cleaned in Oct or Nov 22. Cllr Todd Ferguson took charge of the issue, was told what MoP has been told. The case is ongoing. There is a project for such issues, but it's not as intense as it used to be. Only 11 people in charge of maintenance of NAC paths etc.

3. Road closures between Hunterston and Peel roundabouts

Complete closures for the next 2 weekends: from 8pm on Fri Mar 10th to 6am on Mon Mar 13th and from 8pm on Fri Mar 17th until 6am on Mon Mar 20th.

4. Hunterston SSG

There has been a NDA change in strategy that allows for continuous decommissioning of HNA, avoiding early care and maintenance which was the previous strategy. Due to this the recladding (grey) will not happen.

AlHold HNB has removed 50% of reactor 3's spent fuel to Sellafield.

5. Cable factory Application 22/00712/MSCM and variation of conditions 11,22/00131/PP and variation of conditions 9 and 18 relating to finished floor levels

It may be brought before Planning Committee on 22/03, but it is not confirmed. The variation of floor levels relates to flooding.

6. Clyde Marine Planning Partnership

DN No news. Waiting for the minutes of the latest meeting.

7. Dawn Homes and RES3

<u>DT</u> application for accounts, under the criteria of "open book accounting", was filed before Feb FCC meeting

<u>IM</u> It has been passed on to Chief Solicitor for action before Feb FCC meeting, still waiting for updates

DT cannot understand this delay

8. NAC Planning/Aarhus Convention and ERA

<u>DT</u> The UN challenged Governments, including Scottish Govt, as communities have no right to appeal on environmental issues.

<u>DN</u> if there is evidence of any environmental wrongdoings, now there is an adjudicator. The application process is straightforward.
