1.	The chair welcomed all those in attendance. Apologies were noted.

4	 Matters Arising: Planning Application 23/00144/PP – 9 dwelling houses at Hamfield House has been approved by NAC Planning subject to conditions but conditions not listed on NAC website. B&DCC had expressed concerns about the proposed access roads. There were other public comments with concerns about this proposal but it appears to be going ahead anyway. SEPA Online survey has been completed. Some of the phrasing in the survey wasn't always clear but B&DCC had a Teams meeting to share views and understandings as part of the process.

7.	Updates	
	• GVLP and Working Groups	
	JW wasn't present tonight but Cllr AD and Allan Wright (K&GCC) were both present and they had attended the supergroup meeting. One of the items on the agenda	
	was the GV Life app that was developed by Beith Trust. Participation is low: if there	
	isn't enough content, getting people to sign up will be difficult. If there is a low	
	uptake, getting businesses on board to use the app will be challenging. Facilities &	
	Amenities had a project for GV2023 and the latest report from the consultant was that they were to design a logo for branding the Garnock Valley. It was then	
	suggested that instead of a standalone project, the GV Life app could become a tool	
	to help with the GV2023 branding. The app also has a logo based on the	
	geographical boundary of the Garnock Valley.	
8.	Locality Participatory Budgeting	
	B&DCC were successful in being awarded £921 towards the costs of the Coronation	
	events. The funds received from NAC this morning. See Appendix 3 for full results. The Locality PB paid out a maximum of £1,000 and the Arts & Culture PB paid out a	
	maximum of £400.	
9.	Coronation Event – Mon 8 th May 2023	
	JW and RW have been working on a proposal for activities at Wilson Street garden.	
	The event will likely run from 1.30pm – 4.30pm. The Town House are having an	
	Afternoon Tea from 11am – 2pm and Norrie Brown has a community barbeque at the Community Garden from 4pm so our event will fit in between these other two	

	events. There was a discussion about hiring a bouncy castle but this would require a risk assessment and a licence from NAC, which is unlikely at such short notice. Normally, they want 10 weeks' notice for the licence. The use of the bouncy castle would only be permitted in dry conditions due to risk of burns like carpet burns with the wet material. Another suggestion had been to seek an indoor space, possibly in the Scout Hall, but this would take people away from the garden. Other events are likely to be a DJ music playing and a draughts competition. It was suggested that we ask local businesses to participate in a best dressed window competition, just like at Christmas time. RW would discuss the feedback with JW and advise	RW / JW
10.	Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) will be carried out for the B714	
	Realignment Scheme Works are going on to ascertain the best access for heavy vehicles to get up the hill. There is a proposal to build a smaller roundabout between the main roundabout and the bridge. As well as planning routes for trucks, they also have to identify routes for the parallel cycle route. Bore hole testing is ongoing.	
11.	Draft Local Transport And Active Travel Strategy 2023 – 2028 Consultation	
	It is difficult to envisage tangible improvements as a result of this exercise. For example, we have said before that we need a better bus service but Stagecoach is a private company and NAC has little influence over them. Instead, it is seen as desktop research for another project in the future.	
12.	Local Development Plan (LDP3) Update	
	The group who are working on Place Frameworks are still working on Kilwinning, Saltcoats and Largs. They are due to come to the Garnock Valley next but there is no start date known.	
	The next stage of the LDP3 consultation is a Place Standard tool where people are asked to rate 14 topics depending on how much improvement they feel that each needs.	
	LDP3 is really important because when developers submit planning applications, if they meet the needs of the Development Plan then there is a predisposition to approve the application, which overrides objection comments / letters.	
13.	Wider B777 Corridor Consultation and Online Survey	
	This survey looks at the cycle paths to Garnock Community Campus. There is an in- person event at Bridgend Community Centre on Wednesday 31st of May 2023 between 15:00 and 19:00. As the B777 goes from Glengarnock to Manrahead and then from the A737 to Gateside, it was felt that there should have been a Beith event instead of relying only on Bridgend.

	Fireworks: RW logged on to a Teams call about a consultation hosted by Scottish Community Councils regarding restricting the sale of fireworks but unfortunately the login details were inaccurate as no one else joined the call.
	Skatepark: B&DCC will sponsor the planning application
	Ayrshire Joint Valuation Board: Cllr DLR advised that AJVB are reassessing property values for tax purposes. They are also including park areas. This doesn't seem to make sense as the park areas have no income but the Skatepark could face an annual tax bill of approx. £1500.
	Manrahead Roundabout : Cllr DLR has asked NAC and Transport Scotland who will maintain the roundabout as he and Kathleen are no longer able to do so. It was expected that this would be Amey's responsibility as the roundabout is a key part of the A737 and therefore shouldn't be NAC responsibility. Former B&DCC member Brian Smith has enquired about planting daffodils to try to improve the appearance of the roundabout.
	Roads programme 2023/24 – Our friends at K&GCC have sent us a list of roads, pavements and street lights to be included in the programme for the new financial year from NAC Roads.
	With no further public business to discuss, the meeting was brought to a close by the Chair.
