8. Coronation Event – Mon 8th May 2023

Fortunately, JW had pre-arranged with Beith Community Association for the use of the hall as a contingency plan in case of inclement weather at the Wilson Street Garden. As the event had moved indoors, we no longer needed to hire generators so instead, West Coast Castles provided us with an inflatable ten pin bowling unit, which the kids enjoyed. Michelle Winslow did the face painting. The leftovers from the hot dog stall were passed to the larder at St Brigid's Primary School, Kilbirnie. We were also grateful to the Beith Theatre Group for performing for us in the next room.

There then followed a discussion led by one of the Beith Theatre Group (BTG) members present at the meeting about a town diary to co-ordinate events, such as fundraisers. This had been tried before but was unsuccessful as some groups didn't put forward their plans. The discussion then evolved into the possibility of having a B&DCC liaison involved with BTG. The counter-suggestion was that since B&DCC has only 5 out of 10 members, perhaps BTG would like to put forward a representative onto B&DCC? All that is required is a KA15 post code and be over the age of 16.

9. <u>Locality Participatory Budgeting</u>

The PB 2022 returns were due back by 30 April 2023 but HM advised she had missed the email. This funding contributed to the cost of installing a Queen's Jubilee bench at the Wilson Street garden.

10. Updates

• Community Mental Health & Well-Being Fund

A project survey had been received but it was not possible to complete this yet as the funds had not yet been spent. This fund had contributed to the outdoor gym project.

• GVLP and Working Groups

JW wasn't present at the Supergroup meeting. There was continued discussion around the GV Life app and how this might tie in with GV2023. Graham at Lateral North liked the ideas behind the app but felt they didn't suit his objectives for a cultural and heritage project. The other app, Places That We Know, might be a closer match to his needs.

We also discussed the proposed CIF application for Beith Community Association. Whilst the PowerPoint presentation was quite broad in focus, the draft Expression of Interest was too narrowly focused on the benefits of the CIF spend rather than how CIF contributed to the overall aims of the project. Further funding would be required later. This might come from another CIF application or from another source.

The next Supergroup meeting will be on Wed 7th June at 7pm in Dalry Scout Hall. The next meeting of the GVLP will be on Thur 15th June at 7pm in Lochshore Hub.

• Streetscene

SB had been talking to one of the refuse workers. He is due to retire in December but early indications are that he will not be replaced. Instead, Streetscene will

reduce their headcount There was also a concern about the weedkiller being used. This was less effective than before so required more applications but there are fewer staff members to apply it. From the NAC councillors present, we were told that the position had not yet been confirmed but the expectation of reducing the headcount was not unexpected, given the pressures due to shrinking council budgets. As to the weedkiller, this was changed a few years ago to a nonglyphosate weedkiller. At first, the idea of an eco-friendly weedkiller seemed like a contradiction in terms but it was explained that the concern was more about the run-off, so that if the weedkiller got into the drains or the seas, it wouldn't kill off animal life. It also helped to make the weedkiller more pet friendly when applied in communal areas around the town.

Fundraising Events

JW and RW proposed a race night to be held on Fri 23rd June. Cllr RS agreed to sponsor a race from his butcher's shop. BTG also have plans for some fundraisers such as a race night in August as well as a Boogie Bingo on Fri 26th May, a play on Fri 2nd and Sat 3rd June and they would be supporting the St Inan's fete at Beith Community Association on Sat 10th June.

Lochshore 5K path

This was scheduled to be completed by the end of March but due to a number of factors, including vandalism, the path is now expected to be completed by the end of March. A question was asked about putting a bin beside the door of the Hub. We were told that NAC Regeneration have about 17 or 18 bins available but these have not yet been installed.

Lochshore Sponsored Walk

We were told that our friends at K&GCC were looking to arrange a sponsored walk on Monday 6th May 2024. This would be open to groups from across the valley and beyond to come and raise funds for their own groups, just like the old sponsored walk organised by the Garnock Valley Rotary Club at Dalry's Blair Estate. The main appeal for moving the walk to Lochshore was that the café would be available to provide catering and toilet facilities, which are not available without considerable expense at the Blair Estate.

• Banners and Posters

A question was asked about siting banners and posters on street furniture such as safety railings and lamp posts. Unless permission was given by Streetscene, it was likely that any such banners and posters would be removed by the council. It was pointed out that even at election time, political parties were not permitted to put up posters. They would also need land owner permission if they wanted to put up a banner on private property
