


Fig 5.1 2017 Place Standard Tool

8. Garnock Valley Locality Partnership

- Dates of next meetings:

 - GVLP will be on Thur 15th June at 7pm in Lochshore Hub.

The long awaited GV2023 has identified 3x strategic goals and 9x local goals intended to be short, medium and long term goals for each of the three Garnock Valley communities. These include Stoneyholm Mill Trust planning an Industrial Design competition to repurpose the old mill, a Kilbirnie Music project and the River Garnock Reimagined.

Beith Community Association have been working on a CIF application for funding for new posts. They had prepared an Expression of Interest, originally for four posts, now reduced to three. These were a Centre Development Officer and a chef (not a cook) in the first year and an additional Activities & Wellbeing Coordinator being added in the second and third years. The Locality meeting did not approve the EoI to become a full application and instead sent it back for further rework.

9. AOCB

K&GCC Project Ideas

Last October, K&GCC arranged a centenary service for the Kilbirnie War Memorial and in May, we held a small, family fun day to mark the Coronation as well as a concert at Kilbirnie Auld Kirk.

Looking ahead, we had a couple of ideas to hold events for the community:

- Sponsored Walk at Lochshore (May 2024)
- Reinstating the Volunteer of the Year competition
- What's On Kilbirnie

The Volunteer of the Year was previously organised by CW and AW. JS was a previous winner from before he became part of K&GCC. For What's On Kilbirnie, we would need to tie in with the NAC Participatory Budget team as they were also talking about hosting an in-person event for community groups.

• Beith & District Community Council Race Night

Our friends at B&DCC are hosting a race night to raise funds for the Community Council. These funds would be used for their own activities, which includes maintaining the Coronation Garden in Wilson Street (so named for the Coronation of HM Queen Elizabeth II, not King Charles III). This event will be in Beith Bowling Club on Fri 23rd June.

• Pavement extension

We were advised that the pavement between Dalry Road and Boag Road was being upgraded. This work would start in August and run until November.

Other Summer Events

- 3 July 28 July 11.30-1.30, NAC Connected Communities were providing school lunches in Bridgend. We were assured these lunches would not interfere with Café Solace's lunches on a Friday.

Iain Walker

We were saddened to learn that Iain Walker, our Vice-Chair, has now been moved to a hospice. Iain has been part of K&GCC for a long number of years. Although he stood down in 2019, he returned in the 2021 election but has been unable to attend K&GCC since Feb 2023 due to ill health.

New Member – Mariette Holland

We currently have 6 members out of a possible 8, including Iain Walker. For the past two months, Mariette Holland, who also volunteers with Café Solace, has been attending our meetings as a member of the public. We were delighted when she agreed to become a new member of Kilbirnie & Glengarnock Community Council.

Next Meeting

Last year, the September meeting was cancelled because the 3rd Monday in September was a North Ayrshire holiday and Bridgend Community Centre was closed. To avoid this issue this year, it was proposed that we meet in the HSCP room at Garnock Campus for September. A further reason for suggesting this is that all the current members of K&GCC live in Kilbirnie. Gordon Keith did not stand at the last election and as such, we have no elected members from Glengarnock. Beith & District Community Council have previously held their March meeting in Gateside, as one of the Districts in their territory. By having the meeting in the Campus, it would be a way to bring K&GCC to Glengarnock.
