We've had some great news stories over the last quarter about work experience and employability successes across North Ayrshire, demonstrating the support that Council contractors are offering to a range of age groups in the region. The pupils also had a chance to visit projects in Glasgow and Fife, broadening their understanding of the business and projects

Systra Ltd hosted a pupil from Irvine Royal Academy at their Glasgow office for one week as part of their work on the B714 upgrade on traffic management.





Redpath Construction are currently refurbishing sheltered housing at Cheviot Court in Irvine, and have offered a range of employability opportunities to local people. A 2 week work placement was arranged for Jamie Beattie (pictured), who has had a fantastic time on site and has been given a "glowing report" by the site Foreman. Jamie is about to return to Ayr College to undertake a plumbing course as part of his ambitions to become a heating engineer, and Redpath have agreed to discuss potential apprenticeship opportunities with their subcontractors that may be suitable for Jamie to consider. Jamie enjoyed his placement so much that he asked to stay on for a few more weeks, which has been supported by CEIS and Redpath: a fantastic result for a keen young man!

From August-December 2023, RJ McLeod ran a CSCS Card scheme at Auchenharvie Academy, preparing the participants to undertake NPORS training ahead of the NPORS Safety Awareness Course - the first step to working on a UK construction site. Study skills support was also provided to

set the young people up for success in their future endeavours.

Spotlight On: Robertson Group

Robertson Group are currently onsite at the new Montgomerie Park Primary School in Irvine, which will be home to over 300 pupils across 12 classrooms, and be the first Passivhaus school in North Ayrshire, with an expected 60-80% reduction in energy use compared to a standard school building.

The team at Robertson's have been working hard to not only get the building work underway, but also to deliver a range of high quality, impactful community benefits initiatives as part of their contract. A key focus has been on employability, with Kelly Harkness, Social Impact Manager at Robertson's, keen to offer as many opportunities to local people as possible while boots are on the ground at the site.

Kelly has worked in close partnership with several local organisations to promote careers in construction, particularly to women. A Women Into Construction course was delivered with CEIS Ayrshire, with 5 local women getting the opportunity to participate in a range of activities designed to build skills and provide meaningful work experience for a potential career in construction. This included completing a range of accredited modules such as Manual Handling and Asbestos Awareness; an extended site visit; a Q&A session with Robertson's staff;

mock interviews; and all participants received their CSCS cards, providing them with the Health and Safety qualification required for site work.

At the end of the course, two participants secured related placements; one with James Frew, and the other with Robertston's bricklaying subcontractor on the site itself. Another participant was offered a job during the course due to begin in early 2024.

Kelly has also proactively engaged with local schools, attending employability and careers events to promote the range

of opportunities available in construction. The Design Manager for the project spoke with pupils at



Kilwinning Academy about what it means to work in a job they may not have considered before; and pupils at Auchenharvie Academy got the chance to speak with Robertson's staff at their recent careers event. Kelly plans to hold further events aimed at women interested in construction over the remainder of the contact, including over International Women's Day.
