4.	Police Report						
	There was no one present from the police. Chief Inspector David Cameron has left and Sgt						
	Douglas Clark is covering his position in Irvine. The Sept stats are recorded in Appendix 1.						
5.	Guest Speaker – Nick Wright, Place Plans						
	Place Plans are not NAC driven but are supported by various groups in the Garnock Valley, such as						
	K&GCC, Beith & District CC, Dalry Community Development Hub, Dalry Community Sports Club						
	and Beith Trust. Of the recent survey, there were 744 responses: 308 Beith, 172 Dalry and 191						
	Kilbirnie. There are public events being held in Kilbirnie (13 Nov), Beith (14 Nov) and Dalry (22						
	Nov). Other events will be arranged for Glengarnock, Gateside, Barrmill and Burnhouse. The						
	survey showed that 82 respondents' top priority was to fix dilapidated buildings and 71 to improve						
	the town centre. Transport issues are also a problem in the Garnock Valley, not just getting						
	around the main towns but getting from the villages to the towns as well, such as Gateside to

#### **NAC Roads**

Communication has been poor on this resurfacing work. Someone sitting in Irvine decided it was a good idea to make the Stockie a diversion without realising that it was a single-track way with only field gates as passing places. There is also work in progress due to the new turbine being installed. Cllr Reid met with NAC Roads and they amended the plan to allow traffic to pass through the works between the Quadrant and Stockbridge Crescent. Even after the works were completed, there were issues with bus routes as Stagecoach were not confident that the road was open, so had the buses terminate back at the cross, which meant people (including elderly) had further to walk to get home.

# **Forestry**

Last November, we heard about plans to create a new woodland behind Ladyland House. Our concern was for the off-grid water supply for up to 30 houses in the area. The plans have been revised to accommodate the water supply and the choice of trees has also been changed.

# **Budget Consultation**

#### **Second Homes**

Concerns were raised that bereaved families should not be subject to the same council tax treatment as those with holiday homes.

# 8. Garnock Valley Locality Partnership

#### 9. AOCB

#### Locality PB

There were 22 requests for funding with only £18k available. This means that most groups should receive some funding. Voting is underway for people to choose which requests should be funded. K&GCC has a bid in to buy flowers for planters next year. Café Solace has a bid in, as does Bridgend Community Centre for the larder. Donald Reid has a bid in through the Barrmill Jolly Beggars (though not as a councillor!). KTCMI has a bid in as well.

#### Pension Credit

We have received a poster asking if people are over state pension age to check their eligibility for Pension Credit. This is a gateway benefit that will allow them to claim, among other things, winter fuel allowance. Single people need to earn less than £218.15 per week, or roughly £11k per annum and couples £332.95 per week, or roughly £17k per annum.

#### Lochshore

The new play equipment has been constructed but the area has not yet been officially opened as NAC are still awaiting safety certificates. There was also a discussion about potential use for campervans. In the Lochshore Master Plan, there was an area marked off in the north west corner of the park, just off the Lochwinnoch road, that could potentially be used for campervans but there is no funding for this. In the shorter term, the idea of campervans using the far end of the car park next to the Hub are being investigated. We were advised that these were not being looked at for the travelling community but for recreational campervans.

#### Largs Road A760 crash

Police Scotland have released the name of the young person killed in the recent car crash on the A760 as Jonny Baxter, age 22, from Kilbirnie.


# Radio City Association


