Sgt Clark was pleased to note that there had been no accidents on the Beith bypass for a while

NAC Trading Standards have been looking into the sale of vapes, particularly to young people. There was one premise in Beith that was involved with this.

A car was recently set on fire. It is thought an aggrieved ex-partner may have had some involvement in this matter.

Some older Ford Fiestas are at risk of theft, such as the ST model from 2017-2020. These were the first to have keyless entry. Sgt Clark reminded us to use a Faraday pouch for our keys when the vehicle is not in use as these stop signals being transmitted to open car doors, etc.

The new Hate Crime legislation has seen over 3000 calls from the public to the control centre, but thankfully these aren't filtering down to the frontline. There is a difference between not liking someone and using hate speech.

7. Place Plans / Place Framework

The last meeting was held on Tues 26 March. We were joined by two young people. The consultants gave a breakdown of their plan, based on feedback at previous meetings. They are looking for key groups and community events they can attend for the consultation phase. The next meeting is on Wed 24 April in Rosearden Hall, Dalry.

8. Chairs / Vice Chairs Meeting

There was a meeting on 19th March. One of the main issues discussed was on recruitment generally, but also on trying to recruit young people to the community council. This could involve inviting MSYPs, having a school rep or offering it as an opportunity to people working towards their Duke of Edinburgh Award.

9. Wider B777 Corridor Active Travel Study

There was a Stakeholder Workshop on 27th March, held via MS Teams and included Sustrans. We were advised that the Vale Park Bridge is not deemed a strategic asset by Sustrans. They also wanted to make the bridge at Garnock View, known locally as Allan's Corner, a pedestrian only access. This makes no sense, given the number of times that area is flooded when it rains.

10. HSCP Locality Conversations

There is a meeting in the George Steven Centre in Kilbirnie on Tues 16 April, from 5.30pm-7.30pm. Members of the public are invited to come along and share their views on what should be the local priorities for health and social care.

Previous consultations were not well received and led to poor experiences for those attending. It was felt that the people were not listened to and the HSCP closed ranks. Sam Hodgkinson, the former Kilbirnie Community Link Worker, is organising this event, which we hope will perform better.

11. **GVLP and Working Groups**

Dates of next meetings:

- GVLP will be on Thur 13th Jun at 7pm in Beith Community Centre
- Supergroup meeting will be on Wed 1st May at 7pm in Dalry Scout Hall.

There has been no meeting of the supergroup since our last meeting. JW attended the Locality meeting in March and felt it was one of the better Locality meetings. It was suggested that they should bring previous CIF applicants back so that they can tell their story of the difference the money made to their project and the wider community. The Skatepark will be breaking ground this month and work is expected to be completed by September.

A discussion then followed about the difficulties with accessing out of school care in the current climate. Dalry Early Years will retain 1140 hours for children 3-5 years full year cover, but Beith Early Years and Kilbirnie's St Brigid's Early Years will only have 1140 hours over term time for 3-5 year olds cover available. When it comes to childminders, they are still required to do the same planning work as larger nurseries, even though they are on their own. A number of childminders have left in the wake of Covid, when people were working from home and now that people are working from the office again, the number of childminders has not been restored. It is felt that there is not enough support from NAC. The only before and after school care in the Garnock Valley for working parents of schoolchildren is Beith Hive and Yellow Brick Road Nursery in Kilbirnie.

It was also noted that the Christina's Locality Team staff numbers have been reduced. Garry Brown and Garry Tait have been redeployed while Stewart Beck and Andy Gregory have taken early retirement from NAC. The team has been joined by Gavin Ferguson

from the Three Towns and Heather Branley, who previously worked in Kilwinning and the North Coast.

12. SEPA

SEPA have launched a consultation on review of areas most at risk of flooding across Scotland as well as looking at disrupting criminal dumpers

13. <u>A.O.C.B.</u>

Parking Enforcement Officers

This is the new name for traffic wardens. From 28th March, they will be giving out warning notices but from Mon 15th April, they will be issuing fines of £100 for parking on the pavement or other infringements. There has been a mixed response in the community. Some people think it is just about revenue generation whilst others are thankful to be able to walk on the pavements again. The scheme is at an early stage but the suggestion was made that we should be asking for monthly reporting, similar to what we get from Police Scotland. We were advised there are no current plans for regular reporting but ClIr DLR said that we could make an FOI request, possibly in a few months to see how the scheme has developed over 6 months.

D-Day 80 Years

The church minister will give a dedication at the war memorial. The Drama Group are arranging songs and poetry from 7.30-8.30pm. B&DCC will be in the Community Centre. Catering has been organised with sandwiches, tea and coffee. Frances Oates, who knitted the figures, will light the beacon. Robert Jamieson will be the bugler, though they are still looking for a piper. Sgt Clark was very helpful in advising on procedures for arranging the parade.
