## **Community Benefits News and Thanks**

We had a busy end to 2024, with several wishes being delivered in December, for which we'd like to thank everyone who helped make them happen!

• Skip donation from **Lowmac Alloys** to **Freedom Fighters**, a trauma-informed mental health and addiction recovery charity, who are clearing space at their current site.

 Donation of £200 from Go-Wright to Kilbirnie and Glengarnock Community Association to support The Wee School Pantry, a community food larder that supports people with dignified access to affordable food

• Donation of £100 from **Whitewall Marketing** to The Ayrshire Community Trust's **Kindness Krew** project, which was providing lonely and isolated people with support over the

Christmas period.









We also wanted to pass on the thanks of several groups who have benefitted from a donation of laptops from Re-Tek this year, who we began piloting donations of refurbished Council laptops with in 2023. This year, they've donated 9 laptops to community projects across North Ayrshire, enabling the creation of plans, presentations, admin support and office tasks. The groups supported are Largs Community Council, Ardrossan Winton Rovers CIC, Three Towns Community Shed, Friends of Lochshore Park and the 25 Group Royal Observer Corps

Association, who manage the Skelmorlie Secret Bunker. **RJ McLeod,** currently on site at Ardrossan Campus, have been supporting young people interested in potential careers in construction to gain their CSCS cards, enabling them to take up valuable practical work experience opportunities in the sector. 7 young people from **Ardrossan Academy** and 3 from **Garnock Campus** have completed their course this year with support from staff at the business. There was a 100% pass rate and the award ceremony will be happening soon!



Morgan Sindall, the next contractor at Ardrossan Campus, have also been engaging with school pupils around the work they'll be undertaking as part of the school build. 38 pupils at Irvine Royal Academy (below) took part in a presentation about the construction industry and routes and pathways into the sector. Pupils thoroughly enjoyed the presentation.




## **Community Benefits News and Thanks**

Managing Director Roddy Frew said: "Our team at James Frew take great pride in


supporting the local community, The Stevenston Christmas lights switch-on is such a special event for the families of Stevenston, and we're thrilled to play a part in creating festive memories for families in

## **Spotlight On: Ashleigh Building**



**Ashleigh Building** are currently working in Irvine, building over 200 new homes for social rent on the site of the former Ayrshire Central Maternity Unit, which had previously lain vacant for over 15 years. The site is the largest new build development the Council has ever commissioned, and will provide a range of homes, including wheelchair accessible and amenity housing.

The contractor has begun to deliver a range of projects in the local authority linked to its work on the site, providing direct support to communities through donations, work experience and links to employability programmes.

#### **Community Support: Irvine Christmas Lights Switch On**

Irvine Community Council are tasked with organising the town's Christmas lights display each year, something that is becoming increasingly challenging with the rising costs of services and a reduction in the financial support available from North Ayrshire Council. Ashleigh were approached by the group in the run up to the festive season, and the company were able to donate over £3,000 towards the cost of the lights, enabling the Community Council to bring some festive cheer to the town centre and brightening up a difficult time of year for many people.

#### **Employability Partnerships.**

Ashleigh have also been working with local partners in North Ayrshire, including CEIS and the Council's Equal Supported Employment programme. At CEIS' recent Construction Sector Based Work Academy, Ashleigh were able to bring their experience as a large building contractor in to the sessions and bring to life the discussions with the participants. Business Services Officer Martine Brown at CEIS said that Ashleigh "agreed to support 2 or 3 2-week work placements. CEIS and Ashleigh worked closely to determine what projects were underway in the local area and would suit the type of work the candidates wanted experience in." Working together with a local partner who has the networks in place to support people into work is a significant strength of Ashleigh's approach, which can also be seen in their recent information session with Equal Supported Employment.

Nikki Skelding from Ashleigh met with young people interested in a career within the construction industry as part of a Modern Apprenticeship information event, helping to answer questions about what it's like to be a Modern Apprentice within the sector, and the benefits of this approach - learning and earning! - over more traditional routes into work. Nikki and the team at Equal plan to work

together over the course of the contract and we're looking forward to seeing other young people get involved in similar opportunities in the future!

- Bypass Art are the culture and heritage arm of Dalry Community Development Hub, and are looking for a structural engineer who can give them some advice as part of a project they currently have in the planning stages
- Corrie and Sannox Village Committee are planning their upcoming maintenance schedule for their village hall and are looking for someone who can undertake a building survey to inform the prioritisation of their plans
- West Kilbride Civic Society are looking for support and advice around publicising their activities, engaging with new audiences and attracting younger members, particularly through digital media.
- West Kilbride Community Initiative are looking for some hands on practical support to paint some walls and railings and install some shelving and cupboard doors
- Impact Arts have a small back garden at their premises in Irvine which is underused and under-loved. They're looking for some volunteer time to help create an outdoor seating area for summer.

- Cornerstone Community Care are looking for some help to pressure wash and resand their garden area to freshen it up for their clients
- Cumbrae Forum are looking for a small ramp to be installed at their charity shop to help improve accessibility for wheelchair users
